On Saturday (September 6, 2025) multiple undersea submarine cables in the Red Sea had been severed, causing widespread internet disruptions across parts of Asia, the Middle East, and Africa. The affected cables include the South East Asia-Middle East-Western Europe 4 and the India-Middle East-Western Europe, both vital for regional. Submarine cables are the bridges of our modern world. They enable people across continents to talk to each other at a minimal cost. Today, more than 95% of international data traffic flows through subsea cables, making them as critical to modern economies as air routes, ports, and energy pipelines. Muscat: Internet services across large parts of Asia and the Middle East faced disruptions on Sunday after undersea cables in the Red Sea were damaged, slowing connectivity in several countries.
